## **TOWN HALL QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

#### 1. How do we connect to our members and constituents of Plantation UMC?

- Table A: Determine first the members that are here and who has moved away.
- Table B: Call people like we did during COVID. Call on birthdays and anniversaries
- Table C: Mission projects
  - Men's Fellowship
- Table D: Phone calls or/and cards to people we know are not coming saying "I miss you what can we do to help you get back to worship." Involve active members. Simple way to connect with church when there are problems such as sick family or other issues. Such as care
- Table E: Pew responsibility take note of who is around you. Follow up with families who had kids baptized. Make personal connection with absent members. Reinstitute "Friends Program". Senior Pastor do home visits.
- Table F: Emails, phone calls, follow-up with a card.
- Table G: Phone call
- Table H: Reach out. Reestablish Sunday School classes, Evensong, Bible studies. Visits for closed. Musical/play skits communicate available for entire congregation.
- Table I: Easy to watch not come. Cannot shut down again. Calls did not work.

- Table L: Maker personal calls to members & friends in small groups call members.
- Table M: Reconnect through phone, text, email, and if possible, a personal visit. A team could be created a "Reconnection Team." This team could be made up of different demographics to connect with the members. This team can try to determine why these members have stopped coming. Is it Covid related, have people moved, have people gotten comfortable with virtual church?
- Table N: More in-depth information about church activities. Connect with a face. Mission Moment.
- Table O: Call, email or text
  - Visitation limited due to Covid
  - Check County records
  - Check Church Directory for phone numbers
- Table P: -Abba Concert / Summer Event for families
  - Free Clinics for adults; Hamburgers/Salads/Beverages, Inflatables for kids
- Table Q: Difficult due to Covid Restrictions
- Table R: We work our way through the church roles, and invite each person to connect to a groups, activity, mission, ministry at least once each year.

# 3. How do we get more persons involved with things that are already in motion such as: Friends of the PUMC library, Life Groups. Sunday School Mission and the After School Tutoring?
